From the desk of our Pastoral Associate, Br. John

Our gospel story today tells us about the conversion experience of Zacchaeus. Zacchaeus is a hated tax collector and therefore considered the “worse kind” of sinner. (Tax collectors in this time stole from their own people, the Israelites, while serving as an intermediary to the Romans. They were hated both for their monetary corruption and for double-crossing their own people). His conversion includes two essential components for our spiritual journey: admitting our sins and completing charitable works.

Zacchaeus, climbing up in a tree for a better view, was “seeking Jesus.” Jesus invites Zacchaeus to “come down quickly.” Zacchaeus was a wealthy man, but to experience Jesus, he must come down. Coming down is another way to describe humility before God. Humility is step one.

Zacchaeus admits his sin. Next, to make up for his sins and to help repair the damage he has done by those sins, he gives to the poor half of his possessions and promises to restore any money that he has extorted, four times over.

We are sinners. We must seek Jesus for forgiveness, and this begins in a spirit of humility. Then we can admit our sins and complete certain actions to help make up for and repair the damage we have created as a consequence of our sin. Let us emulate Zacchaeus and do everything we can to seek Jesus.

El relato del Evangelio de hoy nos habla de la experiencia de conversión de Zaqueo. Zaqueo es un odiado recaudador de impuestos y, por lo tanto, considerado el "peor tipo" de pecador. (Los recaudadores de impuestos en esta época robaban a su propio pueblo, los israelitas, mientras servían de intermediarios a los romanos. Eran odiados tanto por su corrupción monetaria como por traicionar a su propio pueblo). Su conversión incluye dos componentes esenciales para nuestro camino espiritual: admitir nuestros pecados y realizar obras de caridad.

Zaqueo, subido a un árbol para tener una mejor vista, estaba "buscando a Jesús". Jesús invita a Zaqueo a "bajar rápidamente". Zaqueo era un hombre rico, pero para experimentar a Jesús, debe bajar. Bajar es otra forma de describir la humildad ante Dios. La humildad es el primer paso.

Zaqueo admite su pecado. A continuación, para compensar sus pecados y ayudar a reparar el daño que ha hecho con ellos, da a los pobres la mitad de sus posesiones y promete devolverles todo el dinero que les ha robado, cuatro veces más.

Somos pecadores. Debemos buscar el perdón de Jesús, y esto comienza con un espíritu de humildad.

Entonces podemos admitir nuestros pecados y realizar ciertas acciones para ayudar a compensar y reparar el daño que hemos creado como consecuencia de nuestro pecado. Emulemos a Zaqueo y hagamos todo lo posible por buscar a Jesús.
